

Trail Uisp - 25.5 km competitive trail (D+1350)

We will walk from Brisighella's old town centre to the mine of Monticino through one of the most beautiful walkways, the Donkeys Alley, then upwards to the Carné and to the peak of Monte Mauro, the highest spot in the Vena del Gesso Romagnola.

This itinerary is so varied and exciting that you will forget the strain, it is an experience and a pleasure worth sharing. Keep one eye to the path and the other one to the glorious surroundings made of nature as well as evidence from the past: the Pieve and the archaeological site of Rontana and the cave of Monte Mauro. The final is thrilling: from the crest of a gully we will dive into an amazing olive grove and then enter the heart of Brisighella through the Clock Tower climbing its 1000 steps back to the Piazza.

Domenica 29 marzo 2015 | Casola Valsenio, Il Cardello, ore 10.00 **Gessi Wild Trail**

Uisp 21 km competitive trail (D+1150)

Starting from the Cardello of Alfredo Oriani, a monument surrounded by green, we will climb for about twenty kilometres up passes and crests. The backgrounds will be changing so quickly that you won't have a chance to get bored. This good number of ups and downs will be breathtaking in so many ways! Across the long panoramic path you will overview the whole Gypsum Ridge, from the Monte Tondo mine to Brisighella in a single glance.

You can run wildly on stretches of soft grass, 'climb' rocks on all fours, walk in the shadow of chestnut trees, single trek up steep and bare slopes, into wild nature and mysterious caves. We suggest you face this trail relying on your own sensation, without any time and distance reference points (timers to be confiscated at the start).

From Brisighella railway station, to be reached by "Dante's train", we will cross one of the most beautiful Italian villages then climb 5 km to the Rifugio Ca' Carnè, stopping on the way at the geological Museum of the former gypsum mine of Monticino to listen to the tales and sounds of the miners and then at the Rontana archaeological site. After the refreshment we will descend to the former gypsum mine of Marana to immerse ourself in the alpine tale of the Anguanas, the heavenly beautiful long-haired creatures who were supposed to dwell in caves near rivers and to attract and enslave men with their melodious singing, like Homer's sirens.

A musical journey through the female archetypes, where water, mother and stepmother, reaches the cave in a "regressus ad uterum", a symbolic descent into the underworld eventually ending in a new birth.
